- 4.) Congressman Robert Aderholt has travelled to Southeast Europe multiple times in the last eleven years. Congressman Aderholt has built and maintains many relationships with government officials and private citizens throughout the region. This event, The Southeast European Gathering, is an excellent opportunity to connect with those leaders who do not make it Washington DC. He has helped launch and gives leadership and encouragement to all of the Parliamentary Fellowship groups in the region. These groups are modeled after the House Prayer Breakfast Group, which meets every Thursday morning when the House is in session. All of this is connected with the National Prayer Breakfast. Congressman Aderholt has been involved with the House Prayer Group and the National Prayer Breakfast since he came to Congress in 1997.

Mrs. Caroline Aderholt is joining her husband on this trip for she has built relationships with various SE European guests who have attended the National Prayer Breakfast over the years. She is going to give encouragement to the wives of the leaders besides reconnecting with the wife of the former Romanian Ambassador to the USA.

- 12.) The Fellowship Foundation (d.b.a. International Foundation) assists and serves the House and Senate Prayer Groups in organizing the National Prayer Breakfast each year. One outcome of the over sixty year history of the National Prayer Breakfast has been that many countries have weekly groups in their Parliaments where they pray, fellowship and consider the life and teachings of Jesus. This sparks some to want to have a Prayer Breakfast and/or Prayer Groups in their own countries. That is what is has happened in the SE European countries, more specifically Romania, Albania and Montenegro. The Fellowship Foundation is assisting the Romanian hosts to provide organizational and relational support for the SE European Gathering. The Foundation is providing the funds for Congressman and Mrs. Aderholt's travel with no other entity or grant covering any portion. The trip will also include time in Albania and Montenegro for Congressman and Mrs. Aderholt to have private meetings with Members of the Parliamentary Prayer group and other leaders who will not necessarily be able to attend the event in Romania. These meetings are for the purpose of broadening and deepening relationships and the impact of the Prayer Groups as positive, unifying influence in their respective nations.


You must complete a Member/Officer Post-Travel Disclosure Form and file it, together with a Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form completed by the trip sponsor, with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are also required to attach a copy of this letter and both the Traveler and Primary Trip Sponsor Forms (including attachments) you previously submitted to the Committee in seeking pre-approval for this trip. You must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$375 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.

Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House Members may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act (FGDA), gifts "of minimal value [currently \$375] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of minimal value received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.
