HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL 2001

A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROPOSE OR CALL A CONVENTION TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO REPEAL THE SIXTEENTH ARTICLE OF AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES AND TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES PROHIBITING THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES FROM TAXING PERSONAL INCOMES, ESTATES OR GIFTS AND FROM ENGAGING IN ANY BUSINESS, PROFESSIONAL, COMMERCIAL, FINANCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISE EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES.

To the Congress of the United States of America: Your memorialist respectfully represents:

Whereas, the people of the State of Arizona view with growing concern the interference of the Government of the United States in the individual rights and liberties of all persons.

Wherefore your memorialist, the Legislature of the State of Arizona, prays:

1. That the Congress of the United States propose to the state legislatures an amendment to the Constitution of the United States or call a convention for such purpose, as provided by law, to add to the Constitution of the United States an article providing as follows:

ARTICLE

Section 1. The Government of the United States shall not engage in any business, professional, commercial, financial or industrial enterprise except as specified in the Constitution.

Section 2. The Constitution or laws of any state or the laws of the United States shall not be subject to the terms of any foreign or domestic agreement which would abrogate this amendment.

Section 3. The activities of the United States Government which violate the intent and purposes of this amendment shall, within a period of three years from the date of ratification of this amendment, be liquidated and the properties and facilities affected shall be sold.

Section 4. Three years after the ratification of this amendment the sixteenth article of amendments to the Constitution of the United States shall stand repealed, and thereafter Congress shall not levy taxes on personal incomes, estates or gifts.

2. That the Secretary of State of the State of Arizona is directed to send a duly certified copy of this Memorial to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and to each Member of Congress from the State of Arizona.
