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**Federal Funding Secured for Community Projects Across New Jersey's 11th District**

**WASHINGTON, D.C.** — The Office of the 11th Congressional District of New Jersey is proud to announce that ten community projects across NJ-11 have been federally funded through the Commerce, Justice, Science; Energy and Water Development; and Interior and Environment Appropriations Act, 2026. A full list of the projects and allocated funds can be found below:

- **Borough of North Caldwell - \$1.039 million for Multi-Agency Shared Service Records & Communications Equipment**  
This funding will be used to enhance interoperable communications among communication centers across the West Essex area, technological advancements that will enable law enforcement agencies to exchange data in real-time—fostering a safer environment for both law enforcement professionals and the citizens they serve.
- **Essex County Sheriff's Department - \$375,000 for Special Needs Assistance Technology**  
This funding will be used to implement a GPS and voice monitoring technology program tailored to the needs of individuals with special needs. It will enhance the safety and well-being of some of the most vulnerable Essex County residents, specifically youth/young adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder and adults suffering from dementia, Alzheimer's Disease, and other cognitive disabilities.
- **New Jersey State Police - \$400,000 for the Safety Inspection Enhancement Program**  
This funding will allow the New Jersey State Police Firearms Investigation Unit to expand their capacity to inspect state-licensed firearm dealers for compliance with state, and in some cases federal, regulations.
- **Morris County Department of Law and Public Safety - \$800,000 for Public Safety Robot Acquisition**  
This funding will be used to purchase two quadrupod robots for use by the Department of Law and Public Safety in support of state, county, and local first responders throughout the region.
- **Town of Dover - \$1.092 million for Lead Service Line Replacements**  
This funding would be used to replace obsolete lead service lines to provide residents with safe and clean drinking water.
- **Town of Little Falls - \$1.092 million for the Peckman Riverbank Stabilization Project**

This funding will be used to rehabilitate the riverbank of the Peckman River in Little Falls, New Jersey, including clearing, grading, and stabilizing efforts to prevent further erosion at seven highly vulnerable locations along the riverbank.

- **Township of Pequannock - \$1.092 million for a Sanitary Pumping Station**  
This funding will be used to construct a new water treatment facility to remove PFAS contamination from the Township of Pequannock's two primary drinking wells.
- **Township of Nutley - \$500,000 for Booster Pump Station Enhancement**  
This funding will be used to construct a water booster pump station for a safe and reliable supply of drinking water.
- **Town of Millburn - \$1.092 million for the Gilbert Place Stormwater Pump Station**  
This funding will be used to increase the pump station's capacity, upgrade and improve electrical equipment reliability, and provide emergency backup power.
- **Township of Montville - \$1.092 million for PFAS Treatment Implementation**  
This funding will be used for treatment to remove PFAS contamination from three primary drinking wells.
